REGISTRATION

How can I register?

Registration is free for both speakers and attendees. Registration is now open, you can register [here](#).

I want to join a National Chapter or create one, what should I do?

You can write an email to globalforum@democratizingwork.org and our conference manager will put you in contact with the coordinators your national chapter if it already exists or give you all the information needed to create one.

SUBMITTING A PROPOSAL

Who can submit a proposal?

Submissions are open to anyone with an interest in the 3 principles of the #DemocratizingWork Manifesto.

What kind of proposal can I submit?

There are three varieties of proposals. First, you can submit a panel. The panel can be fully (4 speakers panellists including chair) or partially (3 speakers panellists including chair) formed. Second, you can submit an individual contribution (in order to present personal work, share a personal experience, or research), the organizers will assign you to a panel. Third, you can submit a discussion about a book. All sessions will take place on the same website platform.

Should I be a researcher to contribute?

Absolutely not! The important point is that individual contributions should explore at least one of the three principles of the #DemocratizingWork Manifesto, from any relevant perspective: from the perspective of a worker, as a union leader, as a journalist or as a researcher, as an elected official, as an activist... All of these perspectives are valued and relevant to the aims of the Global Forum.

What if I have 2 speakers for a panel?

In this case we suggest submitting two individual submissions so that the organizers can form a complete panel.

How many people do I need to submit a panel?

Each panel can include up to 4 speakers panellists (chair included, technical moderator excluded (in charge of technical dimensions of the call such as unmuting etc.)). At this stage, you can either propose a fully formed panel (4 panellists) or a partial panel (3 panellists).

What should the ideal composition of my panel look like?

We strongly encourage panels bringing together participants from different backgrounds (universities, trade unions, progressive businesses, public institutions, environmental and human rights NGOs, the media) as well as ensuring diversity in terms of gender/race. Each panel will be composed of 3 speakers (up to 4 speakers, if relevant,), a chair who moderates the debate, as well as a technical moderator who is in charge of supporting the panellists during the session (taking care of microphones, etc...). If you do not have a technical moderator the organizing team will provide you with one.

What language can be the panel in?

The discussion can be held in all relevant languages. In terms of outreach, it is important that discussions are held in the language of the country or political area. The language should be indicated clearly when you submit your proposal. Please bear in mind that we are not able to support any translation/interpretation needs.

Can I contribute several times?

Yes! Submit as many times as you like, just complete a new contribution form each time.

Can I submit an individual contribution?

Yes! You can submit by yourself, and the organizers will assign you to a panel.

What is the deadline for submission?

The deadline has been extended to July 25th.

How many people do I need to submit a discussion about a book?

Each book discussion should include a minimum of 3 speakers (chair and author included, debate moderator excluded). You are not necessarily required to be the author of the book, nor must the author take part in the panel, or still be alive.
